

LAW of LIFE # 1 1: The Law of Affinity

(SEVEN ways on how to comprehend the **REALITY** of human situation)

Reasonably, all beings of similar character tend to convene in the same place. Our personal mental condition creates AFFINITY that attracts what is similar to it in the outer world. In order to develop internally the characteristics that are in tune with places, situations and people with a high level of satisfaction, it is essential to keep a constant watch of our THOUGHTS, because they are the tool that programs the MIND and maintains or transforms the PERSONALITY, which is the source of all the human ATTITUDES and BEHAVIORS that may determine our success or failure in our LIFE experience.

Essentially, the art of personal attractiveness is an inner characteristic of the individual that has nothing to do with the concept of beauty, but with their spiritual development. Everyone, without exception, can become highly attractive if they cultivate their inner virtues. These are developed using the techniques of wisdom thinking, directing it in voluntary and sustained way, in order to use the information of wisdom. It will be this information that will make it possible to cleanse the mind of its acquired limitations, learning instead to fill it with the principles of trustworthiness, commitment, loyalty and loving service.

Amorously, the best always associate with the BEST. Everything that we choose to feed internally produces situations, people and places in line with that ENERGY. In practice, we attract WISDOM by thinking the BEST. When we find resourceful ASSOCIATES, they become our “family”, like that dear octopus from whose tentacles we never quite escape, nor in our innermost hearts never quite wish to. Finding intimate companions, we grow together, like the double cherry, seeming parted, but yet union in partition, two lovely berries moulded on one stem; so, with two seeming bodies, but one heart.

Learning the principles of WISDOM is thinking that we are correspondent with ABUNDANCE. “The act of putting into your mouth what the earth has grown is perhaps the most direct interaction with the earth,” so noted U.S. ecologist and author Frances Moore Lappé (1944 -). We must appreciate that there are many reasons for being JOYFUL in LIFE, like British poet Carol Ann Duffy (1955 -): “And we’re all owed joy sooner or later. The trick’s to remember whenever it was, or to see it coming.” Your motto must be that of British poet, painter, engraver, and mystic William Blake (1757 - 1827): “Energy is Eternal Delight.”

Integrating into our PSYHE the principles of WISDOM is thinking that every living being deserves our RESPECT. It is deeply focusing on our capacity for COMMITMENT. We always involve ourselves in events that make us feel SATISFIED. We make a vow that our SERVICE is available to others; that we are able to generate TRUST; that everything we do fill us with ENTHUSIASM; that we have all we need for our HAPPINESS. This means always singing like English writer John Milton (1608 - 1674): “The melting voice through mazes running; untwisting all the chains that tie the hidden soul of harmony.”

Tuning into the principles of WISDOM is thinking that our agreements require our LOYALTY.; always thinking about something that brings us PEACE. It is seeing LIFE as MUSICAL like English physician and writer Thomas Browne (1605 - 1682): “Sure there is music even in the beauty, and the silent note which Cupid strikes, far sweeter than the sound of an instrument. For there is a music wherever there is a harmony, order or proportion; and thus far we may maintain the music of the spheres; for those well ordered motions, and regular paces, though they give no sound unto the ear, yet to the understanding they strike a note most full of harmony.”

Yearning for the principles of WISDOM is thinking that we have the virtue of PROSPERITY; that we have the capacity to express HARMONY; that we were created with a perfect pattern of HEALTH, as British physician and microbiologist Edward Bach (1880 - 1936) noted: “Disease is in essence the result of conflict between soul and mind - So long as our souls and personalities are in harmony all is joy and peace, happiness and health. It is when our personalities are led astray from the path laid down by the soul, either by our own wordly desires or by the persuasion of others, that a conflict arises.”
